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DAVIS BEHAVIORAL HEALTH DISCUSSION ON PARENT'S EMPOWERED

53 Danielle Kaiser explained that she would be taking the place of her colleague, Jess 54 Bigler. Ms. Kaiser introduced herself as a prevention specialist with Davis Behavioral Health. 55 Ms. Kaiser explained the purpose of Communities That Care (CTC) as a prevention system that guides communities through preventing substance abuse and other health problems. Ms. Kaiser 56 57 continued that CTC is partnering with multiple cities in the South Davis area and with Parents 58 Empowered, whose focus is on alcohol abuse. A grant that CTC has applied for requires a 59 partnership with an organization that can help share the prevention messages and tools in areas 60 that a lot of families tend to go, and the Recreation Center was suggested. 61

62 Chairman Arave asked for clarification on who was applying for the grant. Ms. Kaiser 63 answered that the Davis Behavioral Health and Communities That Care was doing the grant 64 work. Councilmember Fillmore inquired if the design of the project would be created for 65 everyone or specific to the Recreation Center. Ms. Kaiser reported that the design would be 66 tailored to the Recreation Center and would be discussed further in the future.

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DISCUSSION ON GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND FOR 2021 ELECTION

Chairman Arave gave his opinion that the District is not ready to move forward this election season as there are still many unknowns. Mayor Earnshaw asked if funds were available separate from the bond, that the District could use to purchase available property. Chairman Arave stated that he believed there to be money in reserves with nothing prohibiting the District using that money to purchase available property. Mr. Miller reminded that approximately 1.35 million is budgeted for the construction projects happening in the Leisure Pool and Lap Pool this fall.

Councilmember Fillmore asked if the District is not ready to move forward will the
District use the next few months to gather more information to then proceed. Chairman Arave
suggested getting approval from Bountiful City for park space, a possible agreement with North
Salt Lake for land, and obtaining a commitment from the County for funds, before proceeding
with a bond election. Chairman Arave asked if the District had to extend the existing tax that
pays for the current bonds, or if the tax remains in place as long as it is used for facilities. Mr.
Blakesley answered that the original documents will need to be pulled and reviewed.

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*County Representative Bret Millburn arrived at 3:58 p.m.

Chairman Arave asked if a resolution needed to be approved that stipulates from this
 point forward that certain costs are bondable. Mr. Blakesley stated that the District would obtain
 bond counsel and adopt that kind of resolution but that is not in this bond being presented today.

92 Mrs. Money pointed out that this year has built up a lot of momentum regarding the 93 possibility of going through the bonding process and appreciated the use of the term delay to 94 bonding. Chairman Arave asked if the Board needs to formally accept a bond before the District 95 can start accumulating costs towards the bond. Mr. Blakesley confirmed that is true. 96 Councilmember Fillmore asked if reserves are used to purchase land before having gone to a

97 bond election that the District would not be reimbursed. Chairman Arave stated that is probably

true and added that going through the bond resolution can last quite a while and it would not be

99 uncommon to have a year of due diligence.

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101 CONSIDERATION OF A MOTION TO DELAY OR ADVANCE BOND RESOLUTION 102 FOR NOVEMBER 2021 ELECTION

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104 Councilmember Fillmore made a motion to advance the movement towards a bond
105 resolution, not for the November 2021 election, by obtaining agreements with interlocal parties
106 by end of calendar year and to retain bond counsel to advise the District as it begins in earnest
107 the process of bonding. Mrs. Money seconded the motion. Board Members Meyers, Fillmore,
108 Earnshaw, Romney, Arave, Millburn and Money voted "aye."

110 <u>COVID-19 DISCUSSION</u>111

Mr. Miller inquired if anyone had heard anything new from the Health Department on requiring District staff to wear masks. Mayor Earnshaw mentioned an email about a possible third booster shot. Chairman Arave said he has no problem putting educational material throughout the recreation center. Mr. Millburn asked if staff is experiencing an increase in positive cases and Mr. Miller answered there was one instance about a month ago.
