Board Members Meyers, Money, Romney, Lewis, Arave, Earnshaw, and Fillmore voted "aye."

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PUBLICE HEARING TO DISCUSS PROPOSED ADAPTIVE PROGRAM AND **ASSOCIATED FEES**

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At 6:17 p.m. Mayor Romney made a motion to open a public hearing to discuss proposed

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94 95 adaptive programming and associated fees. Mayor Earnshaw seconded the motion. Board Members Meyers, Money, Romney, Lewis, Arave, Earnshaw, and Fillmore voted "aye."

lessons the District already offers. Mr. Miller added there is little to no overhead costs for these programs, because equipment needed is already onsite. The proposed programs would run for 6 weeks and 1 hour in length. Fees are as follows:

> Volleyball - \$35 Basketball - \$35

Pickleball - \$35 Learn To Skate - \$35

Fitness classes would be available at the admission rate of \$4.50 per class and would run throughout the year. Unique fitness programs would be \$35 for a 6-week program. Bingo would be offered at no cost.

There was no public comment. Mrs. Money asked if the District staff would be running the courses or if Imber Services would be in charge. Mr. Miller answered that District staff would run it, but Imber will be there with their clients for assistance and problems.

At 6:21 p.m. Mayor Earnshaw made a motion to close the public hearing. Mayor Lewis seconded the motion. Board Members Meyers, Money, Romney, Lewis, Arave, Earnshaw, and Fillmore voted "aye."

RESOLUTION APPROVING NEW ADAPTIVE PROGRAM AND ASSOCIATED FEES

Mayor Earnshaw made a motion to approve Resolution 2021-4 adopting adaptive programs and fees to the South Davis Recreation Center. Mr. Meyers seconded the motion. Board Members Meyers, Money, Romney, Lewis, Arave, Earnshaw, and Fillmore voted "aye."

<u>UPDATES ON MASTER PLAN AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENT PROCESS</u>

Mr. Miller reported that he has met with North Salt Lake to discuss options with them and are working with Bountiful City to formally commit to the pool project. Mr. Blakesley said that he pulled the 2013 bond repurchase documents and the attorneys who advised on that bond issue were lawyers from Gilmore & Bell. They would be his recommendation for local government entities and they have history with the District.

Chairman Arave asked if this service should go out for a bidding process. Mr. Blakesley

answered that it is considered a professional service and because they have familiarity with those documents and with the specific requirement to these issues. Chairman Arave directed Mr. Miller to engage with bond counsel.

Bret Millburn arrived at 6:28 p.m.

Mr. Miller reported that another option that has not been explored is a fieldhouse and said many new facilities are including them. Those who have built them have said they don't have to do any programming as it constantly booked for reservations and is a great source of revenue with little expenditures.

UPDATE ON HIRING PROCESS FOR NEW HEAD SWIM COACH

Mr. Miller reported that Chad Reimschussel, has been hired as the new Head Swim Coach. Mr. Reimschussel has 15 years' experience coaching and came with high recommendations. A meet and greet will occur on September 27th at 7:00 p.m.

COVID-19 DISCUSSION

Mr. Miller reported that he is working with Mr. Blakesley regarding the President's vaccine mandate for employers who have over 100 employees. Mr. Blakesley stated that he didn't know when the Department of Labor would release the rule spelling out exactly how the mandate applies and what it means. Mr. Blakesley said that there is a significant state preemption because in a special session the Utah legislature passed a law prohibiting any local government from mandating vaccinations for employees. Mr. Blakesley stated there are two exemptions to the mandate, one being disability and the other being religious.

Chairman Arave asked if the District could even ask how many employees are vaccinated or if it violates HIPPA. Mr. Blakesley replied that the District is not a healthcare provider and asking would not be a violation. Mr. Blakesley stated that employees who elect not to answer the question not be pressed for one. Mr. Blakesley imagines that when the District goes out for a healthcare bid that vaccination status will be asked about.

Mayor Lewis asked how many employees the District has. Mr. Miller answered that there are over 300 employees, but some work infrequently.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Mr. Miller reported on the following:

- Leisure Pool construction has begun, and roof decking has been removed.
- Fire suppression system is being removed in the pool areas.
- Tnemec paint work is being prepped.
- October 23rd Spook-tacular.

Because of the pool being closed, members are eligible for free tickets to Spook-tacular and can receive free skate rentals on Thursdays.

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Dogapoolooza had about 100 dogs.

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Councilmember Fillmore asked if the outdoor pool required an annual maintenance of draining and re-filling the pool. Mr. Miller stated that is done because of Dogapoolooza but that it is beneficial to drain it. Councilmember asked how much water is used to drain and refill the pool and what the cost is for that water.

Mrs. Money asked when the Ice Ribbon is expected to open. Mr. Miller answered end of November or early December.

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Mr. Miller reported that in the next few weeks there will be more information coming on the cost recovery process.
